# Microblading-Eyebrow embroidery -What To Expect For the First Month

## First 1-3 days

For the first 1-3 days the color will appear to be 30% darker. Though it is rare we've had cases where clients present light swelling or inflammation for the first couple of days. Please keep in mind this is normal.

## 4-5 days

Throughout the first 4-5 some clients have expressed irritation concerns. Not to worry it is completely normal to experience some irritation including the feeling of an itch on your brows. It is important you do not pick at the area as forcefully removing the scab may result in loss of pigment.

## 5-7 days

This will be the time where scabbing will most likely present itself. Make sure not to pick at this area. It is important to let the scabs fall out naturally. After 7 days you are now able to moisturize the eyebrows with grapeseed oil, neosporin, or aquafor.

## 7-10 days

At this time the scabs will begin to fall off. This may lead to the hair strokes to appear very light. After the scabs fall off the pigment will begin to resurface as your skin completes the rejuvenation period. It is also at this time that you are able to start applying makeup to the brows as you await your touch up date. The pigment will then slowly regenerate day by day.

#### After 28-30 days

You are now ready for a touch up!

#### Long Term Care:

Always use sunscreen

Wait at least 2 weeks to get any sort of cosmetic procedure including but not limited to:

- Facials
- Chemical peels
- Waxing
- Botox
- · Exfoliating Products on the eyebrow area

Clients should also refrain from working out for at least one week after the initial microblading appointment.

Clients with dry skin should use Neosporin or Aquafor to moisturize their scabs to ensure the best results.

In general clients should avoid chemical peels and exfoliation around the eyebrow area as this can lighten the color of the eyebrows. Always remember to use sunscreen if clients plan on being out in the sun for long periods of time.

#### MICROBLADING EYEBROWS AFTERCARE

- For infection prevention, don't touch the eyebrow area.
- It is normal to have some swelling, redness and tenderness. Please don't worry.
- 3. After the procedure, keep the eyebrows away from water for 7 days.
- 4. Aftercare product instructions: each morning and night, apply a thin layer of the A & D ointment after the first 7 days.
- 5. A dark scab is normal the 2<sup>nd</sup> day. To prevent pigment inconsistency, do NOT tear the scab off with your hands. The scab usually falls off within 7 days.
- 6. Touch ups are scheduled for 4-6 weeks.
- 7. Keep the eyebrow area clean and avoid tanning beds, sun, pools, hot tubs, any bodies of direct water pressure. Do not use retinal A. or products that contain AHA's, or similar lightening products on the procedure area (Glycolic, Lactic Acids, ETC) These products will fade your pigment color prematurely.
